Michael Zweiback is an Assistant United States Attorney with the United States Attorney's Office, Central District of California. He has been with the U.S. Attorney's Office since September 1990, and is Chief of the Cyber & Intellectual Property Crimes Section. He investigates and prosecutes complex computer crimes involving the intrusion of corporate and government computer networks, "phishing" schemes, botnets, the distribution of "spam," and e-commerce fraud schemes. He prosecutes offenses involving the theft of Intellectual Property including the theft of corporate trade secrets, criminal copyright, trademark, and violations of the Digital Millennium Copyright Act. Michael supervises seven Assistant United States Attorneys. He was formerly Deputy Chief of the Organized Crime & Terrorism Section.

Todd Alexander, MBA, CPA, CFE, is a partner with Alexander, Juárez and Associates in Camarillo. He was formerly with the Internal Revenue Service for 14 years, and was a Special Agent for his last eight years. His practice focuses on financial litigation and tax controversy, including civil audits and collection matters, with an emphasis on white-collar criminal defense. This includes complex civil and criminal litigation in fraud matters, net worth studies and asset tracing. He is an adjunct professor with Pepperdine University and California State University Channel Islands.
