He was the partner in charge of many well-known clients, including the Dodgers, the Angels, and Fox Sports Network, among many others. Rich managed the Southern California, Hawaii, and Nevada audit practice, served as Pacific Southwest Practice Director, and ultimately was the North America Practice Director.



During the summer of 2001, he was committed to resolving Enron issues, ultimately traveling to Houston to look into the escalating issues at Enron. He spent several months in Washington, D.C. presenting the Andersen story. In May 2002, he was the first Andersen witness (policy witness) in the Andersen obstruction of justice trial in Federal Court.
