As the State's chief fiscal officer, **Controller John Chiang** brings extensive experience and fiscal leadership to the State Controller's Office. Chiang was first elected to the Board of Equalization in 1998 where he served two terms, including three years as chair. He began his career as a tax law specialist with the Internal Revenue Service and previously served as an attorney in the State Controller's Office. The son of immigrant parents, Chiang graduated with honors from the University of South Florida with a degree in Finance. He received his law degree from Georgetown University. Chiang and his wife, Terry Chi, live in Torrance, California.

"Overall, Chiang has been a voice of reason on long-term budget reform, urging lawmakers to store excess capital gains revenue during good years for use in economic downturns.
